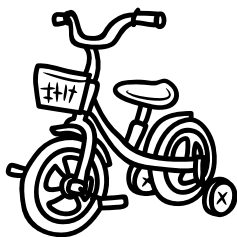
ADJECTIVES

What is an adjective?

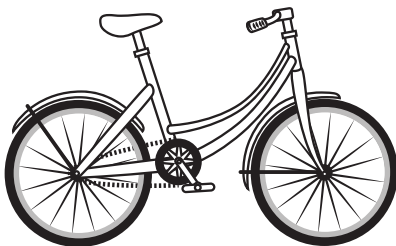
An **adjective** is a word that describes a person, place or thing. Every time you **tell about a subject**, you **use an adjective**. The **subject** of a sentence is always a **noun**.

**An adjective tells what kind or how many.
An adjective tells how something looks,
sounds, tastes, feels, or smells.**

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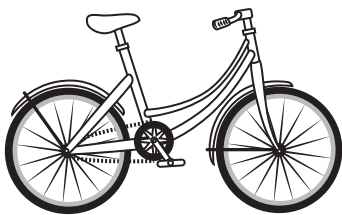
COMPARING ADJECTIVES

When do we use comparing adjectives?

Comparing means pointing out the difference between two or more things. When we compare **two nouns**, we **add -er** to the adjective. When we compare **three or more nouns**, we **add -est** to the adjective.

Compare 2 Nouns

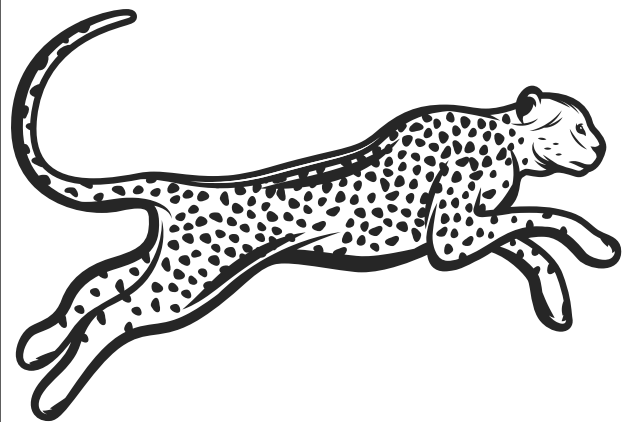
fast → **faster**



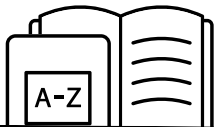
A car is **faster** than a bike.

Compare 3+ Nouns

fast → **fastest**



A cheetah is the **fastest** land animal.

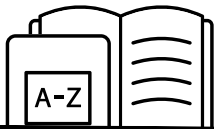

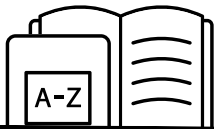

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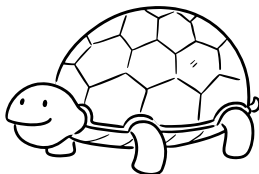

What is an adverb?

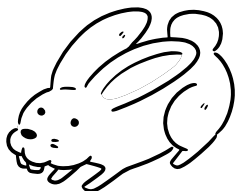
Adverbs are words that describe verbs. Adverbs tell **how**, **when**, and **where** the action is done. Many adverbs end with **-ly**
