"Hello, it's nice to meet you."

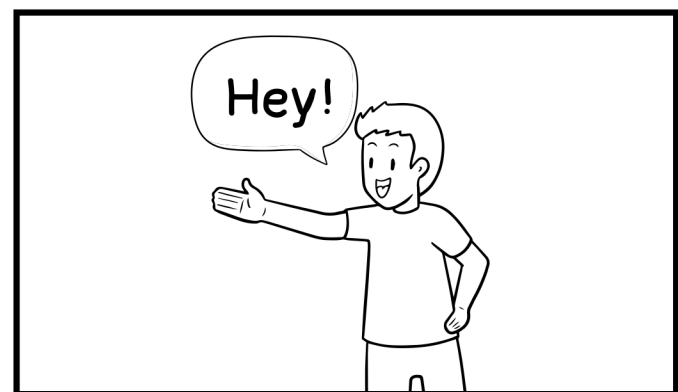


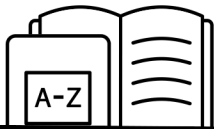
Informal English

"Hello, it's nice to meet you."



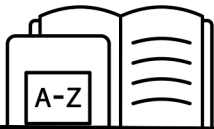

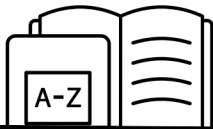

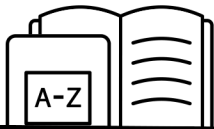
