What is a plural noun?

Nouns that name **more than one**, are called **plural** nouns. Plural means more than one.

What is a singular noun?

Nouns that name **one**, are called **singular** nouns. They talk about one singular thing.

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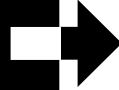
PLURAL NOUNS

There are many different ways to make a noun show that it talks about more than one person, place, or thing plural.

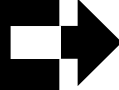
Most words add an **s** or **es** at the end to make them plural.

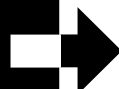
Some nouns turn into a very different word to make them plural. There is no rule for these, so you have to memorize them.
