REFLEXIVE AND OBJECT PRONOUNS

What is a reflexive pronoun?

A **reflexive pronoun** refers back to the subject.

Singular reflexive pronouns end in **-self**.

Plural reflexive pronouns end in **-selves**.

A **reflexive pronoun** is like a mirror that reflects back to the subject.

Reminder: A subject is a noun!

Reflexive Pronoun

George went by himself.

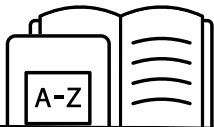
What is an object pronoun?

An **object pronoun** tells who the action is happening to.

Object pronouns usually come after a verb.

Object Pronoun

We met her.
